The mayor also stated that in terms of climate, Miami is an example of resiliency. In the last 10 years, Miami has suffered less property damage than New York, as the city invested to build better and stronger. When it comes to traffic, Miami strives to provide adequate transportation accessibility to complement a system of free buses, trolleys, and a monorail (known as the Metromover). The Brightline has connected Miami Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties. Lastly, Miami continues to promote transit-oriented development. rent, sources said. Hidary declined to comment on rents.
